

Detailed 2026 Health Awareness Calendar for Madison County, Kentucky

January 2026

Top Three Awareness Focus Areas:

- 1. **Cervical Health Awareness Month** Kentucky has among the highest rates of HPV-associated cancers in the nation at 15.3 per 100,000. Madison County women need increased awareness about cervical cancer prevention through regular screening and lifestyle factors that reduce risk.
- 2. **National Blood Donor Month**—Winter months see blood supply shortages, and rural Kentucky communities like Madison County often struggle with access to donation centers. With Baptist Health Richmond and Saint Joseph Berea serving our area, maintaining an adequate blood supply is essential.
- 3. **Glaucoma Awareness Month** Kentucky has an aging population, with Madison County having 26% of residents aged 55 and older (24,419 people). Glaucoma screening is particularly important for our older adults with limited access to specialized eye care.

February 2026

Top Three Awareness Focus Areas:

- 1. **American Heart Month** Heart disease is the #1 cause of death in Madison County, with 185 deaths (196.3 per 100,000 residents). Kentucky ranks 8th highest in the nation for cardiovascular disease death rates. In Madison County, 39.7% of adults have high blood pressure.
- 2. **National Cancer Prevention Month** Kentucky consistently ranks first in the nation for overall cancer incidence and mortality. Madison County has cancer as the 2nd leading cause of death with 164 deaths (174 per 100,000). Cancer prevention through lifestyle modification is crucial.
- 3. **Children's Dental Health Month** —Access to dental care is limited in rural Kentucky. Madison County has significant challenges with dental health access, particularly for children in low-income families. Poor dental health affects overall health outcomes.

March 2026

- 1. **National Colorectal Cancer Awareness Month** Colorectal cancer rates in Kentucky are 27% higher than the US average. Kentucky's screening rate improved to 75.4% in 2020, but rural areas still lag. Colorectal cancer is highly preventable when caught early through screening.
- 2. **National Kidney Month** Kentucky has high rates of diabetes and hypertension, both major kidney disease risk factors. Madison County residents have diabetes as their #1 identified health priority, making kidney health awareness crucial.
- 3. **Brain Injury Awareness Month** Rural Kentucky has high rates of accidents and unintentional injuries. Madison County has accidents as the 3rd leading cause of death. Brain injury prevention through safety awareness is essential for our rural community.

Top Three Awareness Focus Areas:

- 1. **National Minority Health Month** Madison County has racial health disparities, particularly affecting Black residents who have higher rates of certain cancers and cardiovascular disease. The county is more diverse than the average rural Kentucky county.
- 2. **Autism Acceptance Month** Access to autism services and early intervention is limited in rural Kentucky. Madison County families often travel to Lexington or Louisville for specialized autism services.
- 3. **Testicular Cancer Awareness Month** Young men in Kentucky, particularly in rural areas, may lack awareness about testicular self-examination. With Eastern Kentucky University in Richmond, there's an opportunity to reach college-aged men.

May 2026

Top Three Awareness Focus Areas:

- 1. **Mental Health Awareness Month** Mental health is one of the top 2 health priorities in Madison County. Kentucky ranks 3rd in the nation for depression (23.5% vs 18% nationally). Madison County reports 5.9 poor mental health days per month on average.
- 2. **National Stroke Awareness Month** Stroke is the 7th leading cause of death in Madison County, with rates higher than national averages. Kentucky has elevated stroke rates, particularly in Appalachian regions.
- 3. **Melanoma/Skin Cancer Detection Month** Kentucky has significant outdoor agricultural and industrial work, increasing UV exposure risk. Many rural residents work outdoors without adequate sun protection.

June 2026

- 1. **Men's Health Month** Kentucky men have particularly poor health outcomes, with higher rates of heart disease, lung cancer, COPD, and accidents. Men in Appalachian Kentucky have even worse health outcomes than state averages.
- 2. **Alzheimer's and Brain Awareness Month** Madison County has a significant senior population (26% over age 55). Rural Kentucky has limited access to specialized dementia care, making family education and early recognition crucial.
- 3. **PTSD Awareness Month** Kentucky has a significant veteran population, and PTSD can be underrecognized and undertreated in rural areas. Trauma from accidents, violence, and adverse childhood experiences affects many Kentuckians.

July 2026

Top Three Awareness Focus Areas:

- 1. **Juvenile Arthritis Awareness Month** Kentucky has high rates of arthritis among adults (30.8% in 2021), and juvenile arthritis may be underdiagnosed in rural areas where access to pediatric specialists is limited.
- 2. UV Safety Month July is the peak of summer in Kentucky, with the highest UV exposure. Many Madison County residents work in agriculture, construction, and outdoor occupations requiring UV safety education.
- 3. **National Minority Mental Health Month** Mental health stigma can be particularly strong in minority communities. Black residents of Madison County may face additional barriers to mental health care access.

Top Three Awareness Focus Areas:

- 1. **Children's Eye Health and Safety Month** Access to pediatric eye care is limited in rural Kentucky. Many children may have undiagnosed vision problems that affect their learning. Back-to-school timing makes this awareness important for academic success.
- 2. **National Breastfeeding Month** Breastfeeding rates in rural Kentucky are often lower than national averages due to a lack of support, workplace barriers, and cultural factors. Supporting breastfeeding mothers improves infant and maternal health.
- 3. **Back-to-School Health Month** August is back-to-school time for Madison County Schools and Eastern Kentucky University. Focus on comprehensive child health, nutrition, and safety for academic success.

September 2026

- 1. **Suicide Prevention Awareness Month** Suicide is the 2nd leading cause of death for Kentucky youth and young adults. Mental health is a top community priority in Madison County. Kentucky middle school students have concerning suicide ideation rates (17.4%).
- 2. **Childhood Cancer Awareness Month** While childhood cancer is rare, Kentucky families often travel long distances for pediatric cancer care. Awareness about early warning signs and available resources can help ensure prompt diagnosis.
- 3. **Prostate Cancer Awareness Month** Prostate cancer survival disparities exist between Appalachian and non-Appalachian Kentucky. Men from Appalachian areas present with more advanced disease due to delayed care-seeking.

October 2026

Top Three Awareness Focus Areas:

- 1. **Breast Cancer Awareness Month** Breast cancer remains exceptionally high in Kentucky. Madison County has 71.7 cases per 100,000 women. Kentucky women face barriers to mammography access, particularly in rural areas.
- 2. **Domestic Violence Awareness Month** Rural communities often have limited domestic violence resources and longer response times for emergency services. Social isolation and economic dependence can make it harder for victims to leave dangerous situations.
- 3. **Physical Therapy Month** Kentucky has high rates of arthritis, back pain, and work-related injuries. Physical therapy awareness can help residents understand treatment options for musculoskeletal conditions common in rural communities.

November 2026

Top Three Awareness Focus Areas:

- 1. **American Diabetes Month**—Diabetes is the #1 health priority identified in Madison County's health assessment. Kentucky has a higher diabetes prevalence than the US average (12% vs. the national average). Rural areas face additional challenges with diabetes management.
- 2. **COPD Awareness Month** Kentucky is one of 11 states with the highest COPD rates in the nation. About 12.1% of Kentucky adults have COPD, nearly twice the US median of 6.6%. This relates directly to Kentucky's high smoking rates.
- 3. Pancreatic Cancer Awareness Month Pancreatic cancer has a poor prognosis and is often diagnosed late. Kentucky's overall high cancer rates include pancreatic cancer. Awareness about risk factors and early symptoms is essential.

- 1. **National Impaired Driving Prevention Month** Rural Kentucky roads can be particularly dangerous, especially during winter weather and holiday celebrations. Madison County's rural roads and limited public transportation make impaired driving prevention education crucial.
- 2. **Safe Toys and Gifts Month** Holiday toy safety is important for all families, but rural families may be farther from emergency care if injuries occur. Education about age-appropriate toys and safety standards can prevent injuries.
- 3. **Universal Human Rights Month** Health equity and access to care are human rights issues. Madison County's diverse population includes people who may face barriers to healthcare due to language, culture, or other factors.
